## MARKET UPDATE

Philippine equities reversed July's gains in August, with the PSEi falling 4.5% MoM to 5,956.33, pushing the market back into negative territory at -1.6% YTD. Sentiment was weighed by persistent foreign selling, profit-taking in large caps, and a softer macro backdrop. 2Q GDP growth slowed to 2.3% YoY, while the BSP raised its 2027 inflation forecast to 5.4% and delivered a third consecutive 25-bp rate hike to 5.0%. These concerns were compounded by peso weakness, with USD/PHP ending the month at a record 62.260, although the PH 10-year yield eased 17bps to 7.26% alongside lower global yields.

Market performance was also characterized by significant divergence across sectors and individual names. Mining and resource-related stocks outperformed on stronger gold and copper prices and corporate catalysts, including M&A activity, while several large-cap index names came under pressure from profit-taking and foreign selling. ICT, BDO, SM, and ALI were among the key index drags, with ALI additionally affected by its deletion from the MSCI Standard Index. Overall, foreign investors remained consistent net sellers, with August outflows reaching roughly US\$223mn, exacerbated by MSCI rebalancing and block-placement flows. The combination of slowing domestic growth, renewed inflation concerns, tighter monetary conditions, peso weakness, and sustained foreign outflows ultimately pushed the PSEi below the key 6,000 level toward month-end.

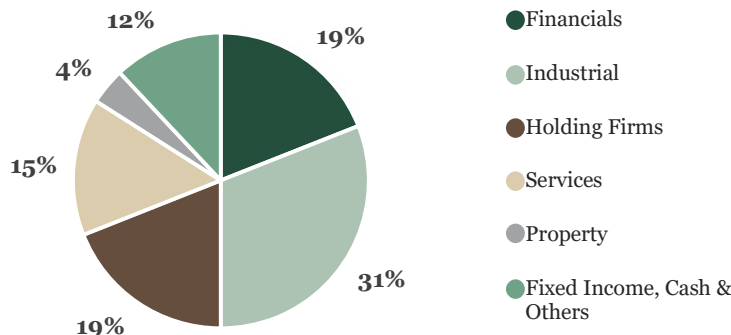
The First Metro Save and Learn Consumer Fund was down 1.68% MoM in August, outperforming the benchmark for the month by 281bps. Key underweight in Industrials and Real Estate sector was the main sources of outperformance while our overweight in Communication Services sector dragged performance.

Philippine equities may continue to trade sideways for the month of September. The corporate earnings season for the second quarter results has wrapped up and while the absolute growth of mid-single digits is lackluster, the silver lining is that they are within expectations. While we continue to see the earnings growth to be subdued for the remainder of the year, we also don't see further potential downgrades from here. Nonetheless, the lack of domestic catalyst for September may temper any potential upside for the market. The undemanding valuations continue to provide support for the market but lingering concerns on inflation, currency, and growth will continue to put investors on the sidelines. In this environment, we continue to take a balanced approach of positioning in high dividend yielders and quality deep value cyclicals.

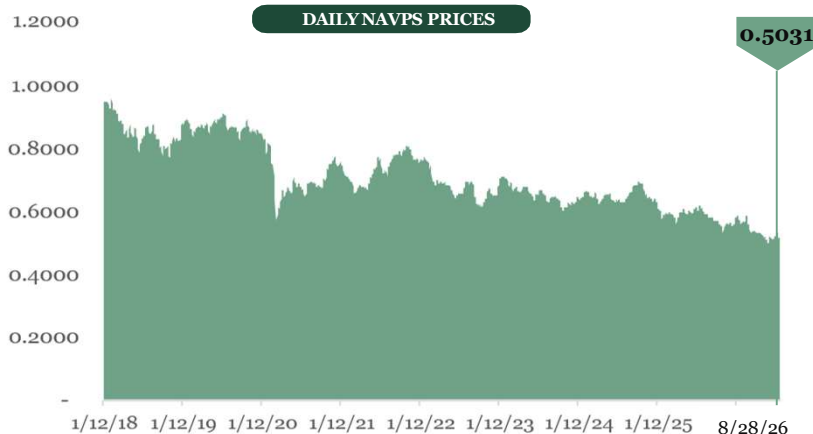
